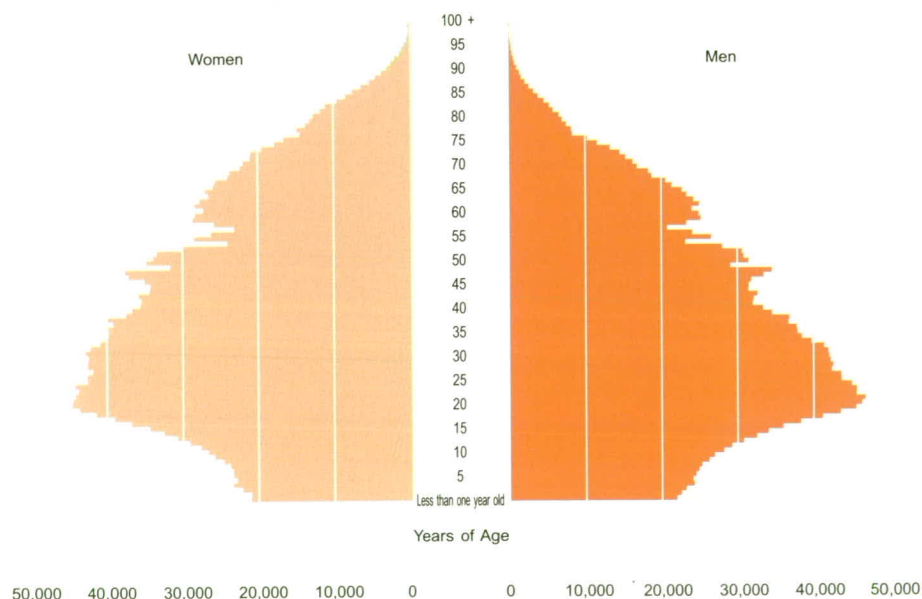

2.2. Population pyramid, 1996

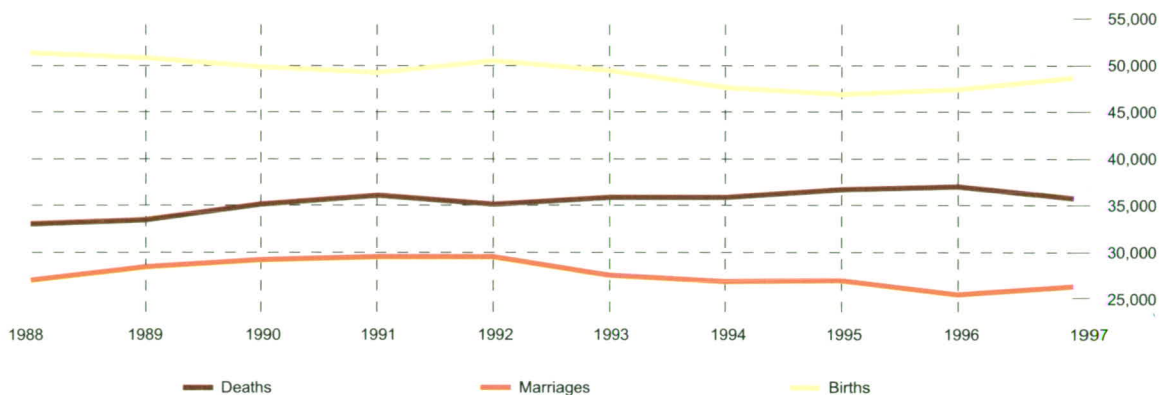

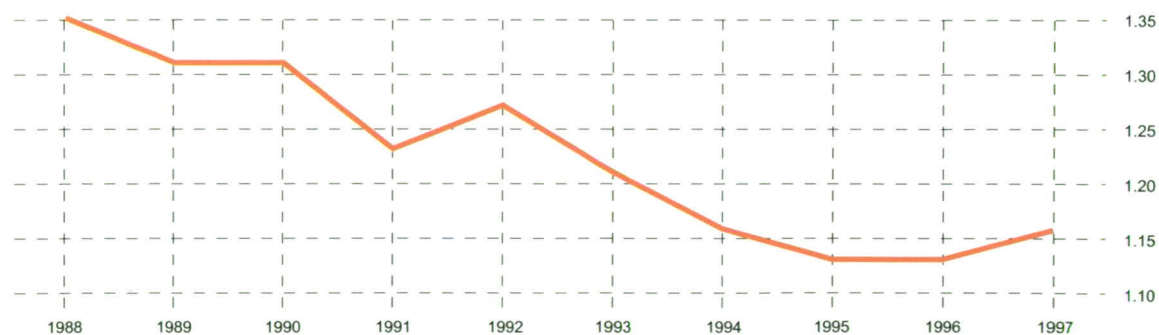

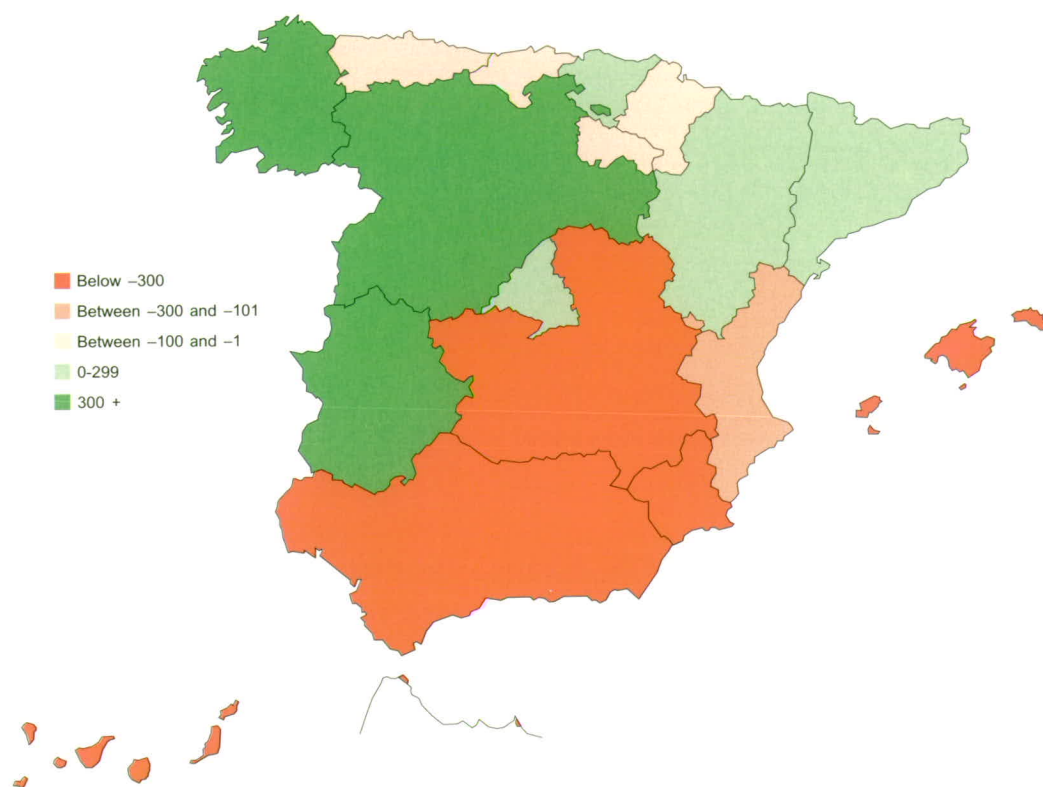
2.4. Year-on-year changes in births, deaths and marriages

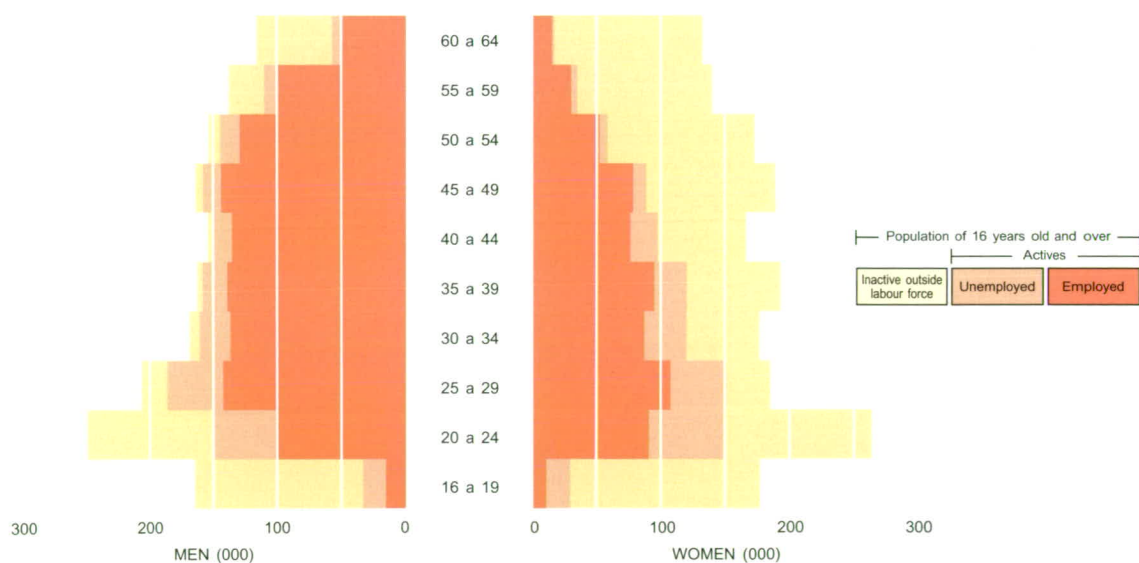

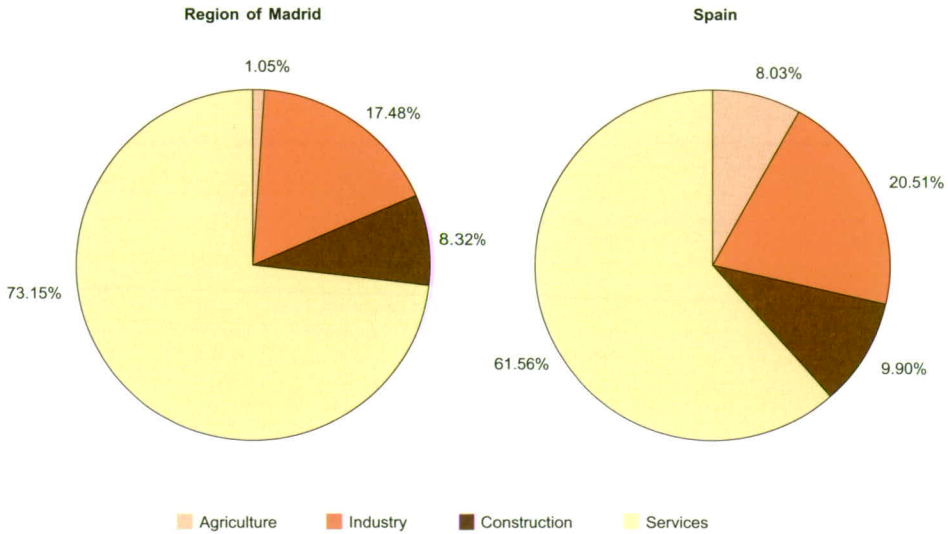

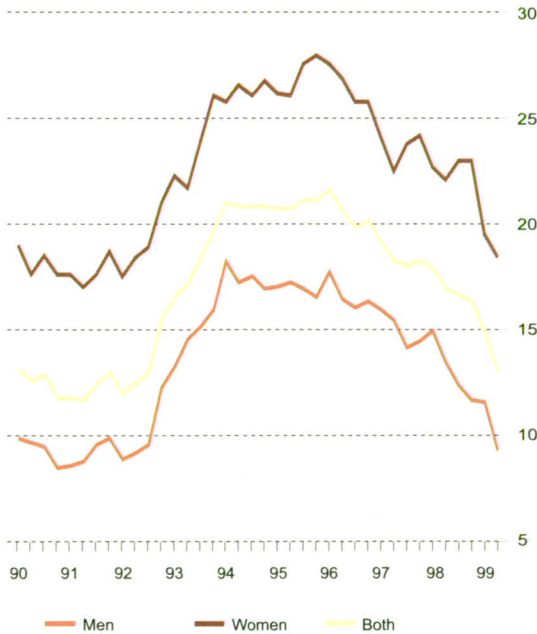
3.2. Breakdown of the employment status by age and sex, 1998



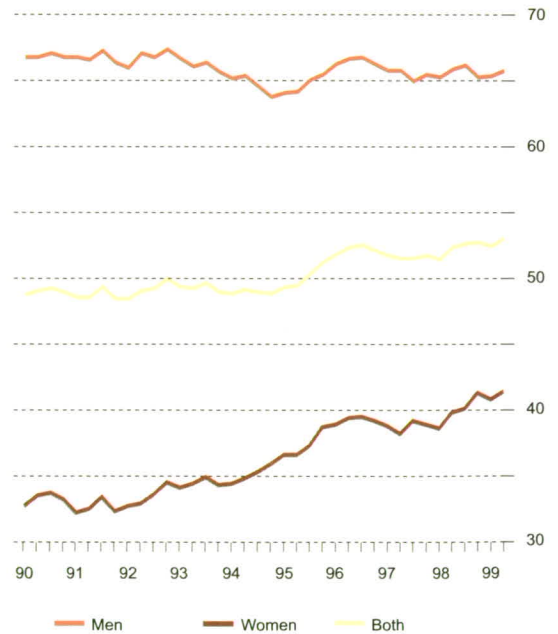
3.3. Breakdown of employment by sectors, 1998

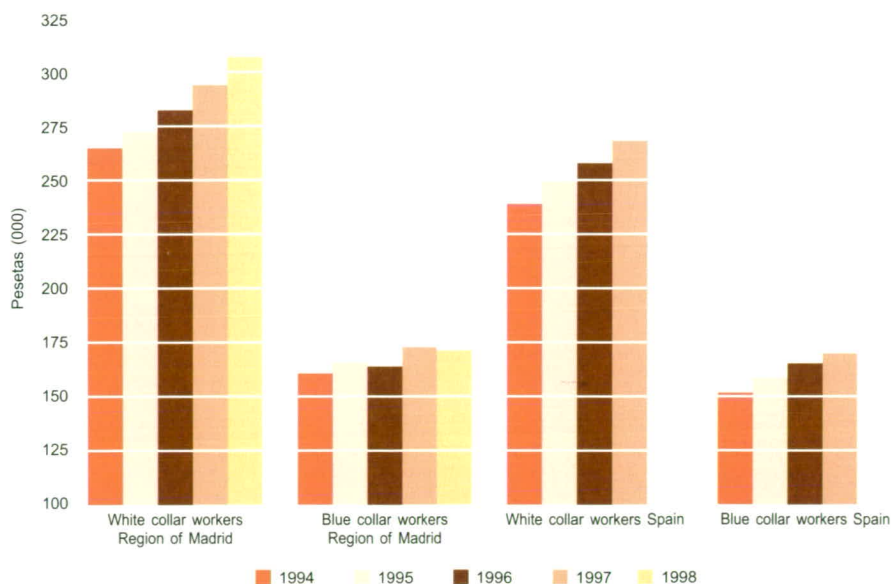

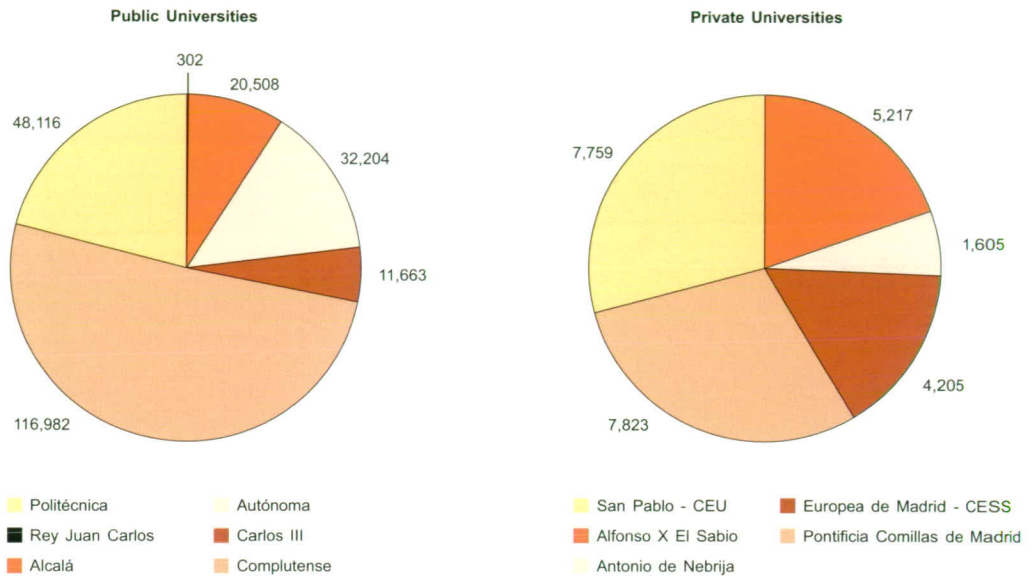

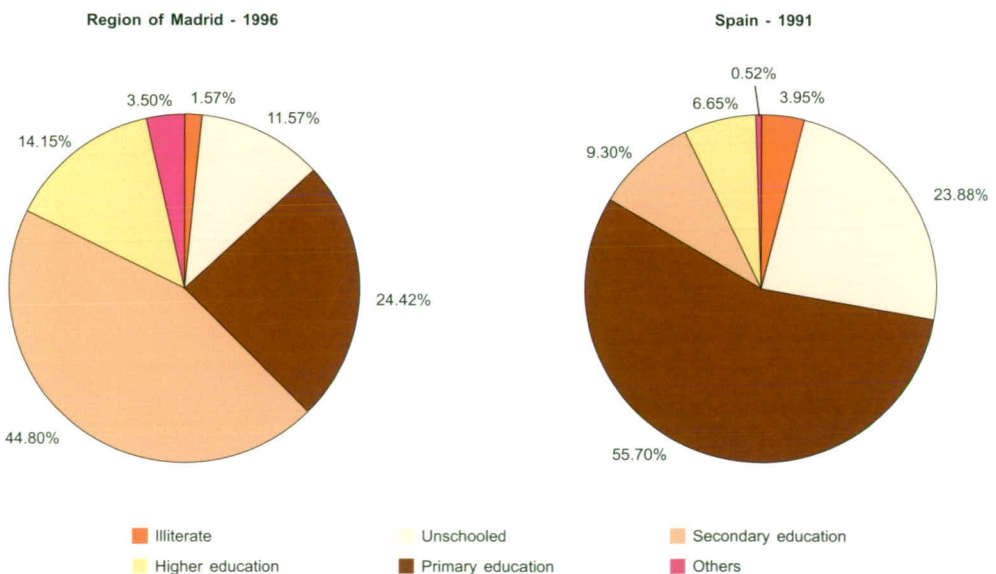

5.4. Breakdown of the population by educational level



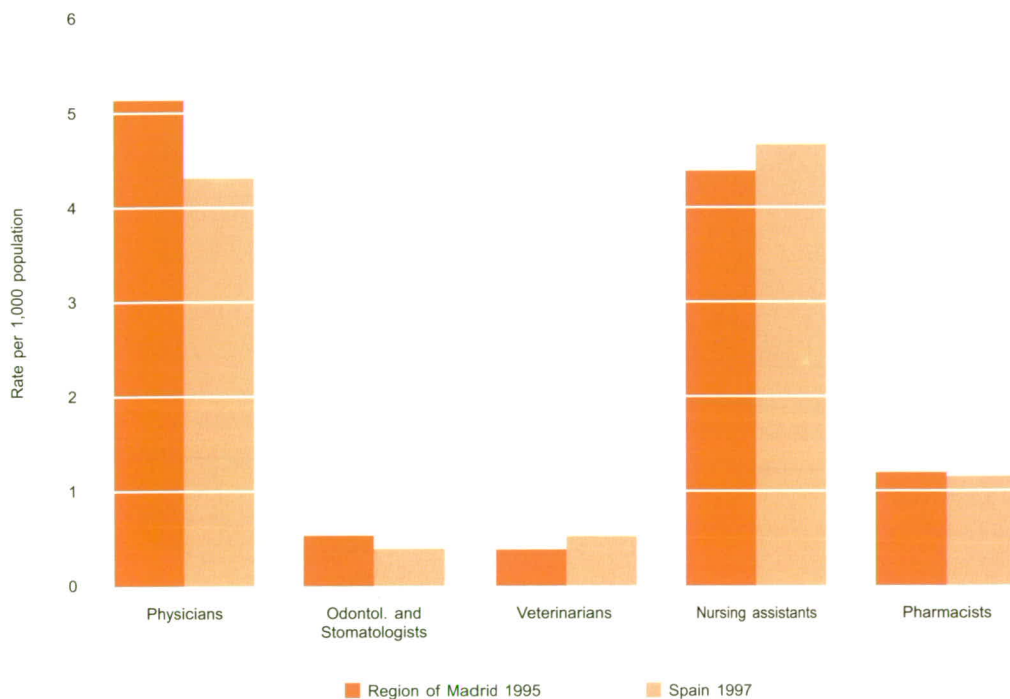

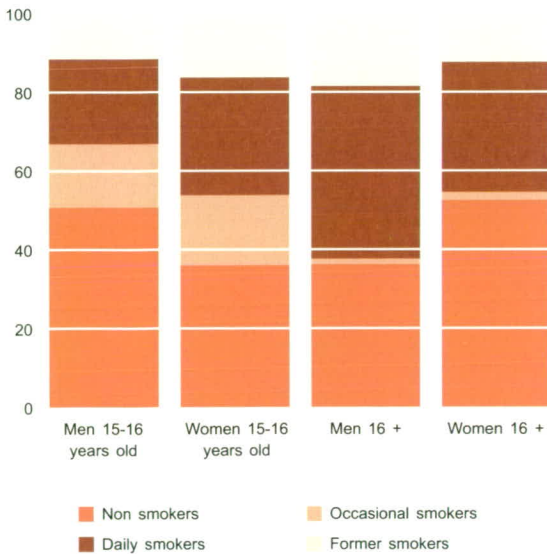

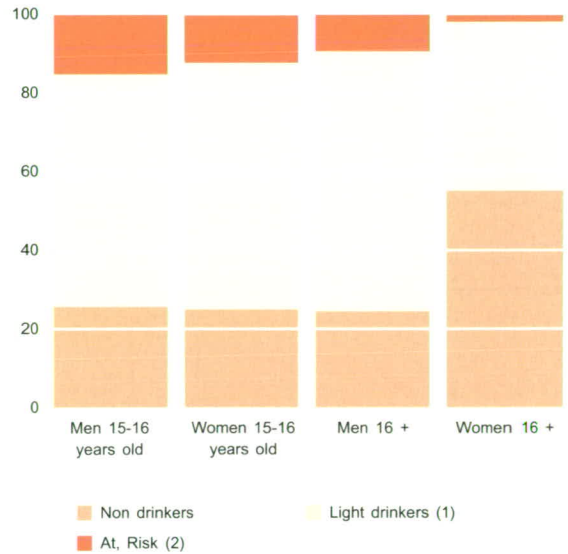

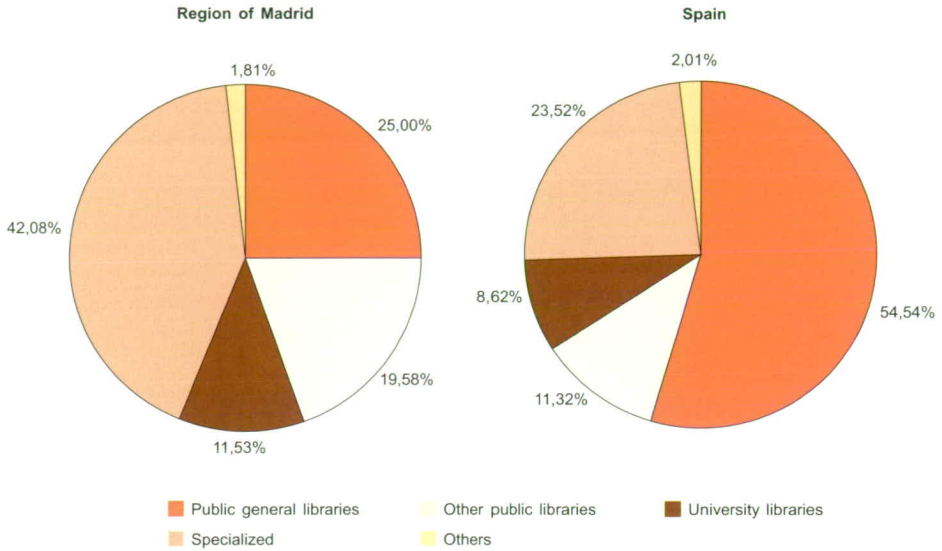

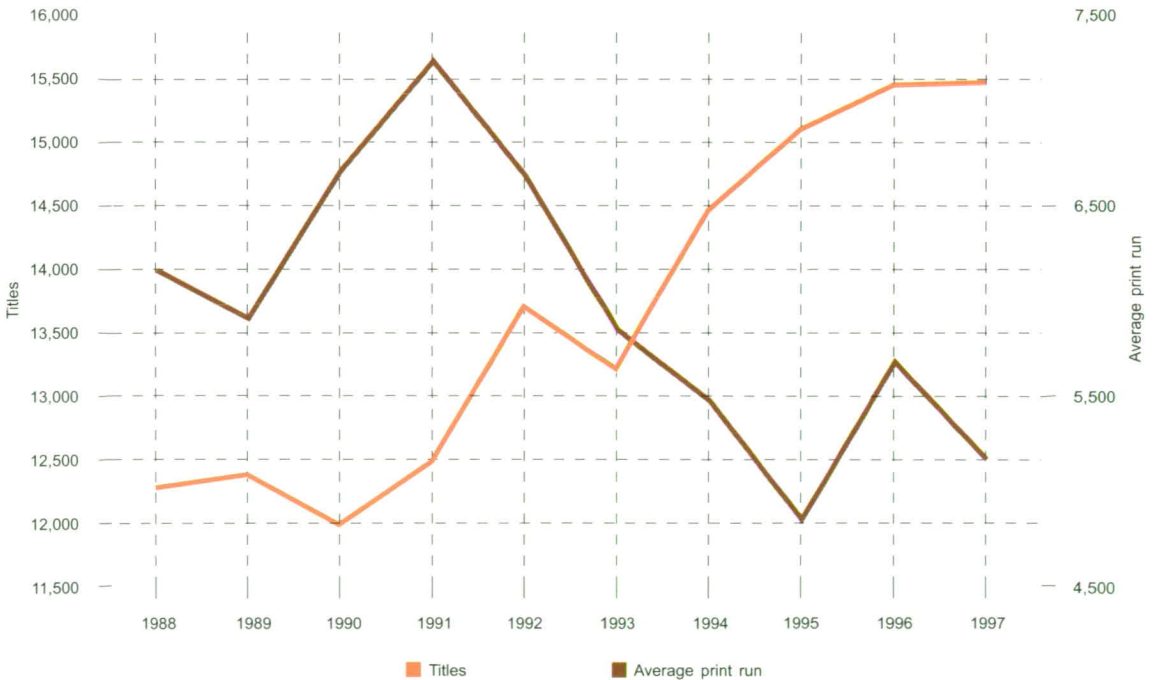

7.2. Book publishing: year-on-year change

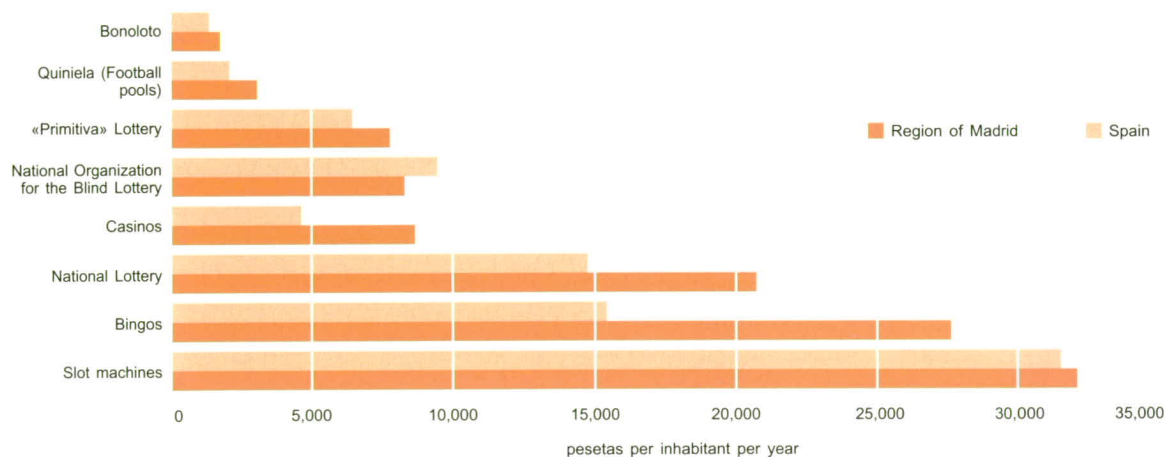

7.4. Annual per capita gambling expenditure, 1997



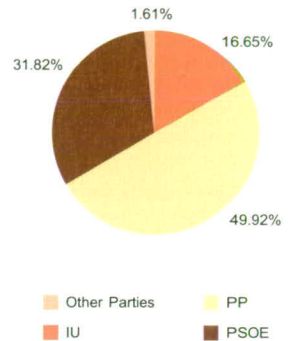

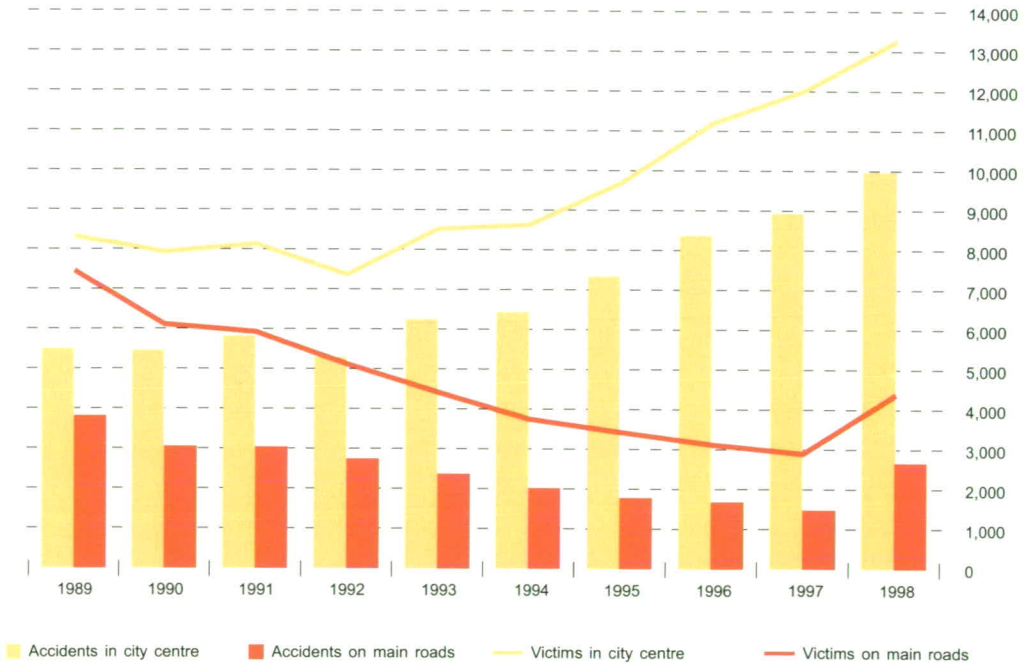

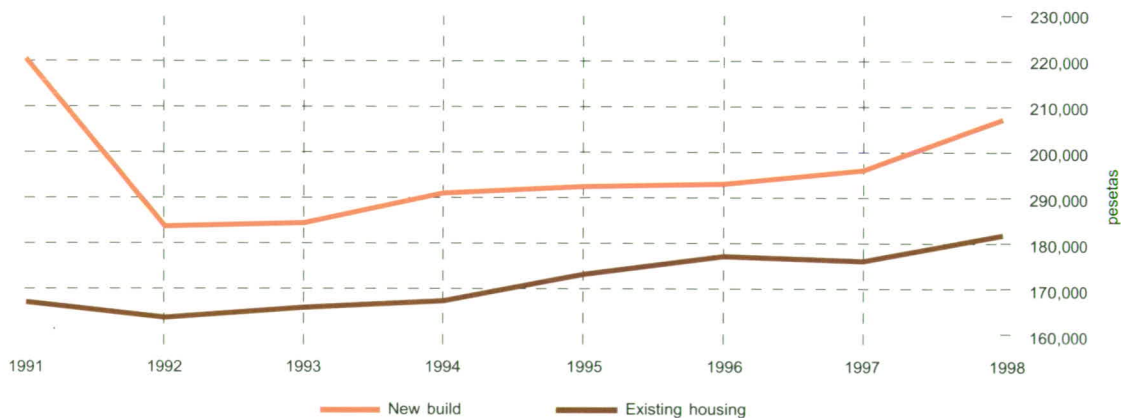

10.3. Quarterly change in sales of concrete

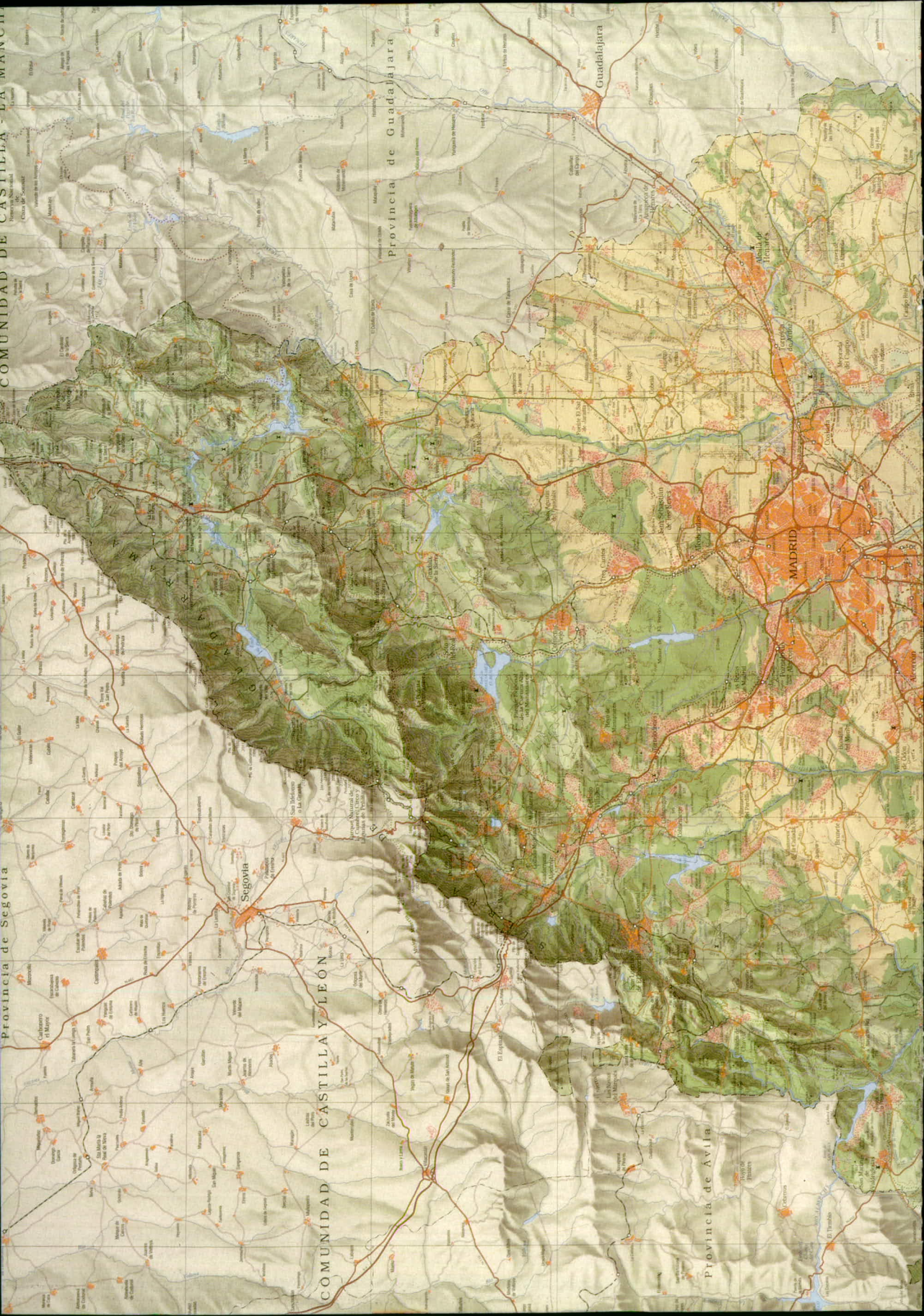


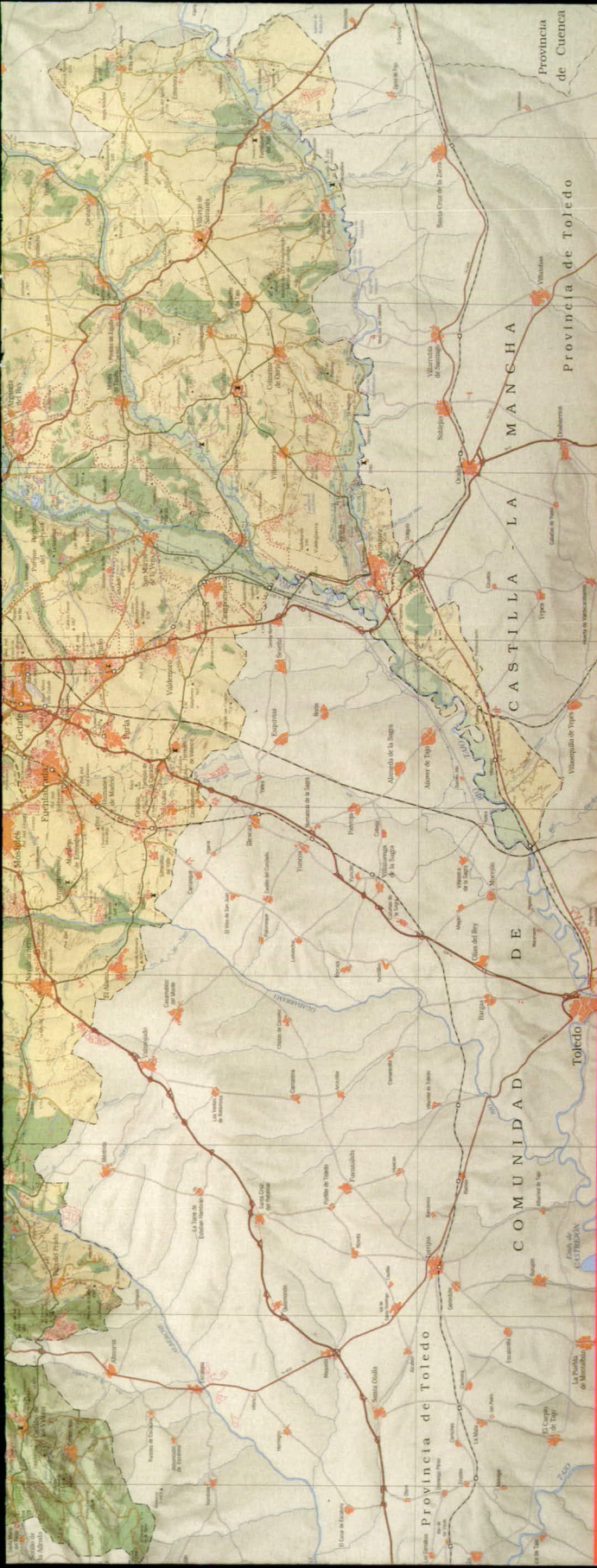
10.4. Price per m² of new build and existing housing



10.5. Breakdown of the unemployment by household in the Region of Madrid, 1998





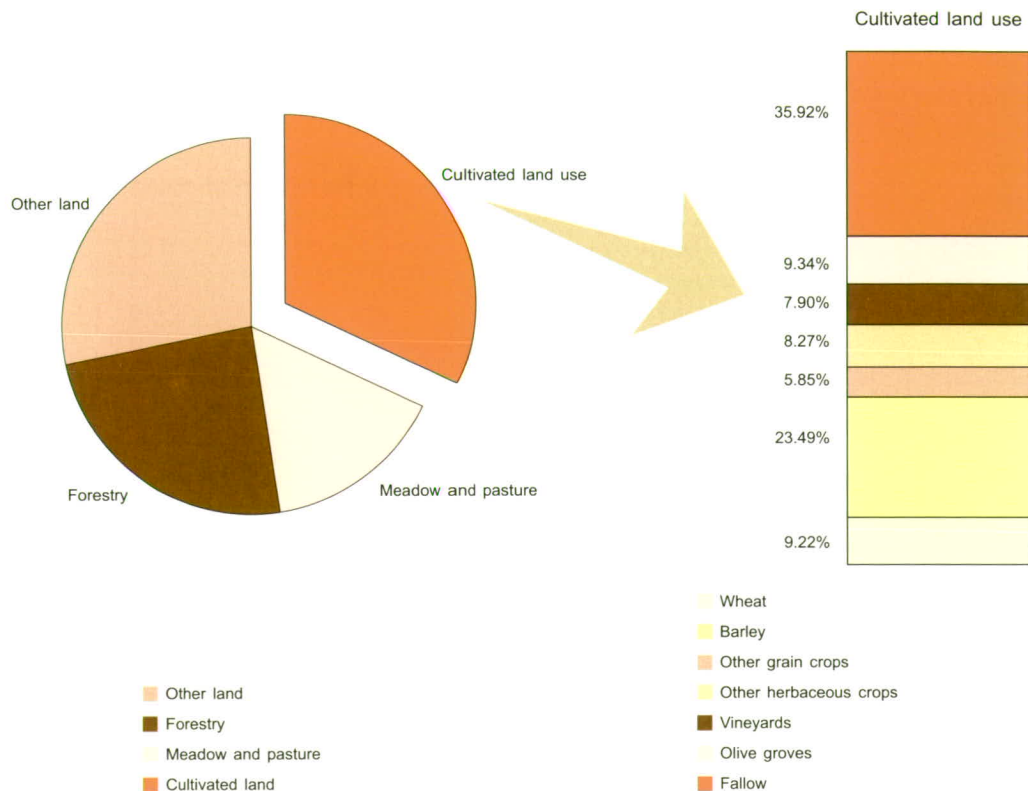

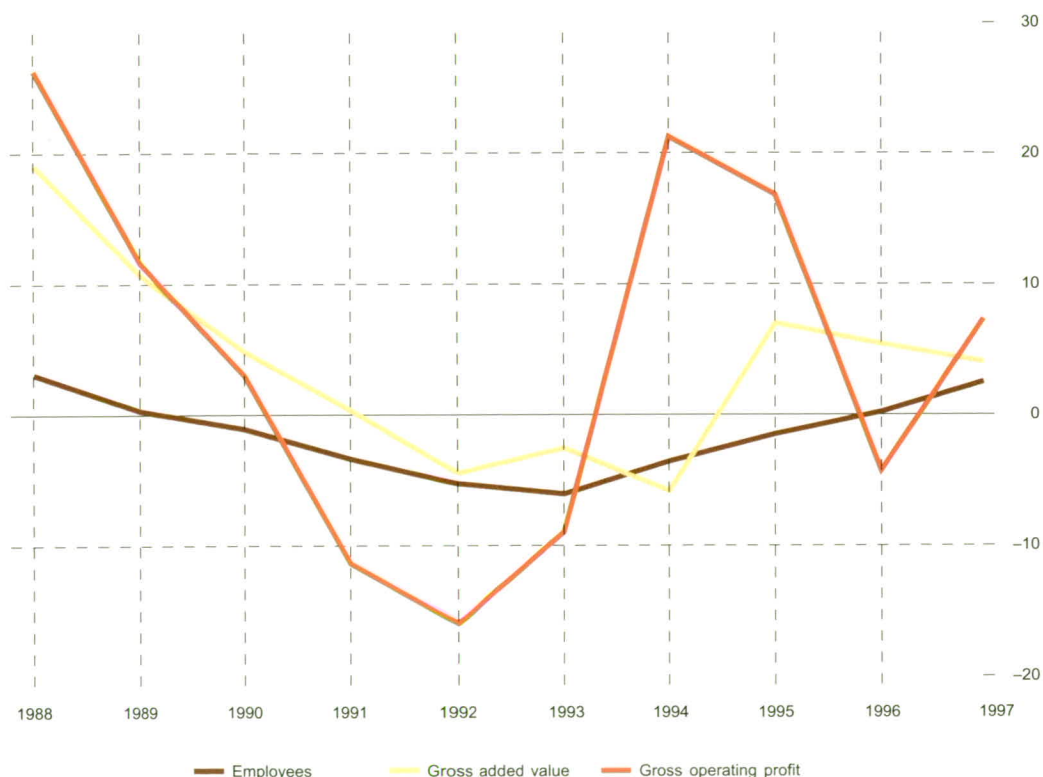

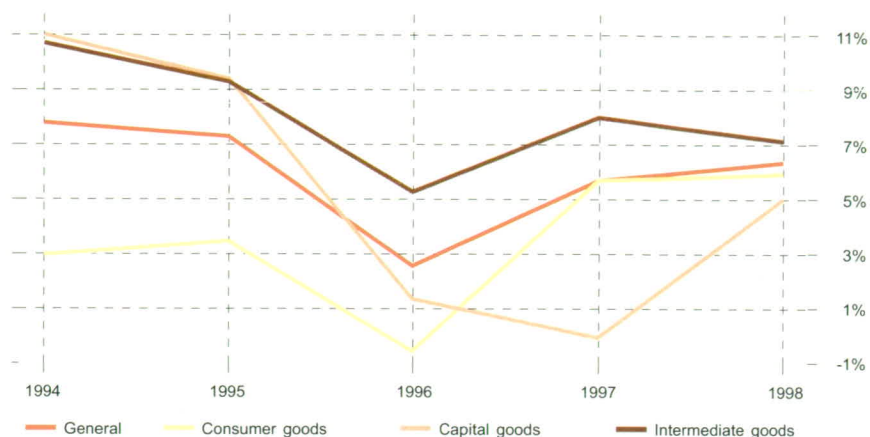

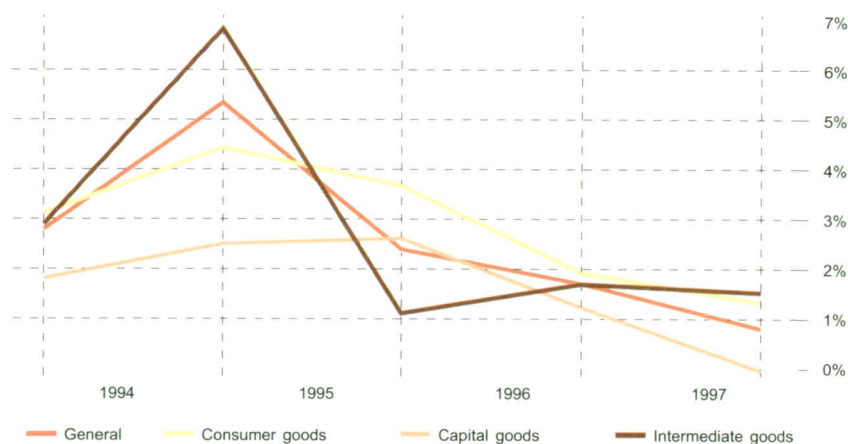
12.2. Industrial sector: year-on-year change

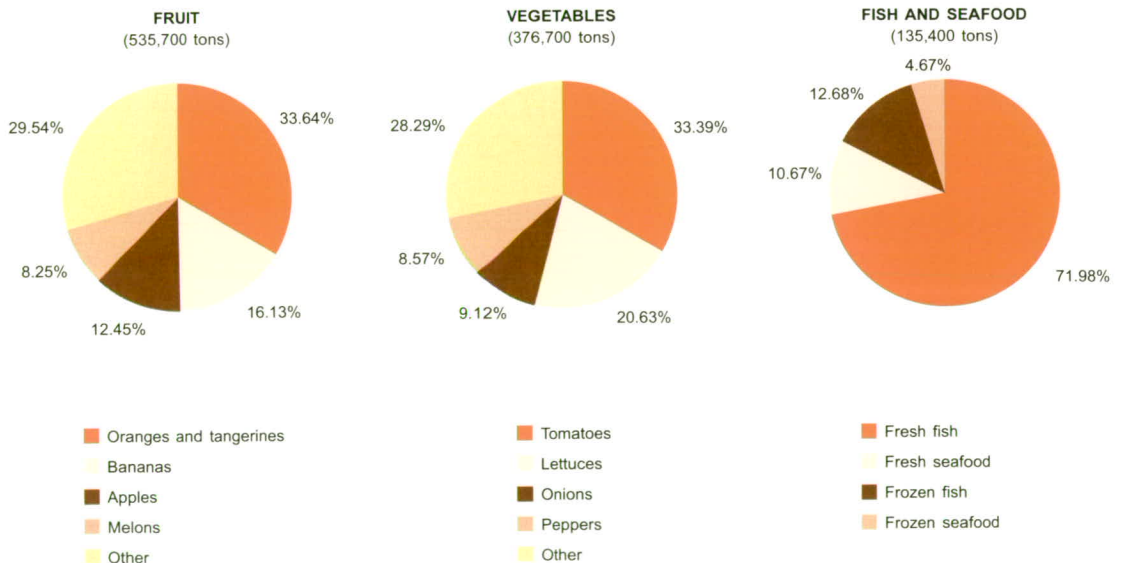

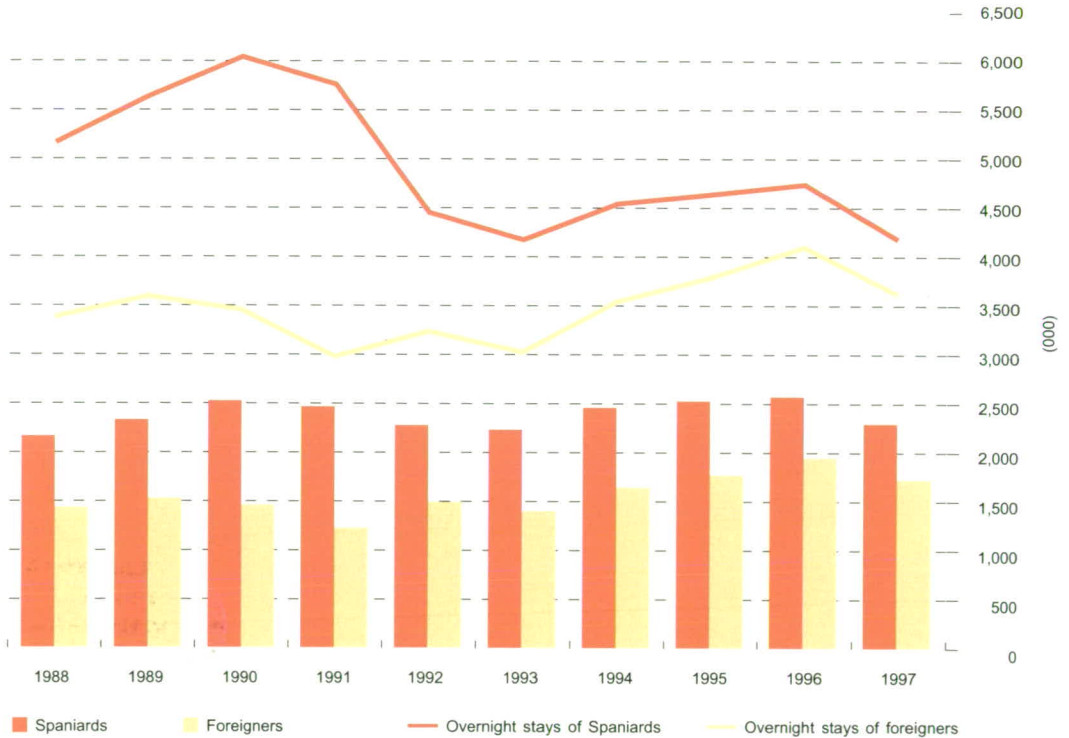
13.2 Most-traded Commodities at MERCAMADRID (Madrid whole sale market), 1998

13.4. Visitors to the Region of Madrid and overnight stays in tourist accomodation



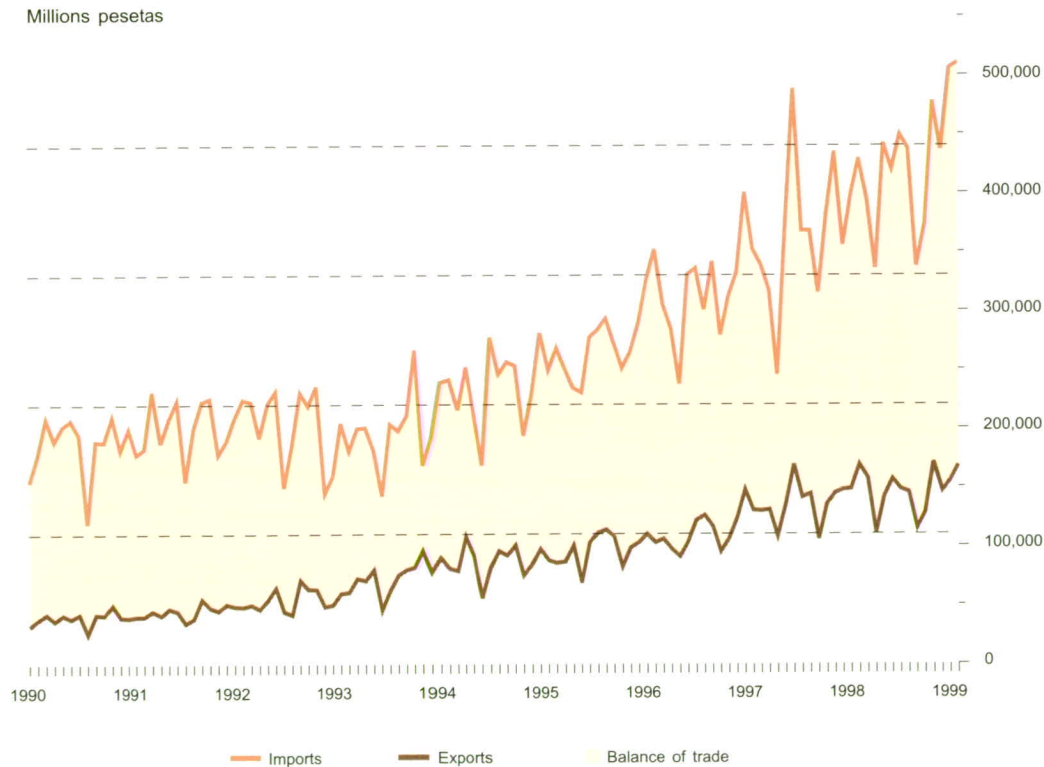

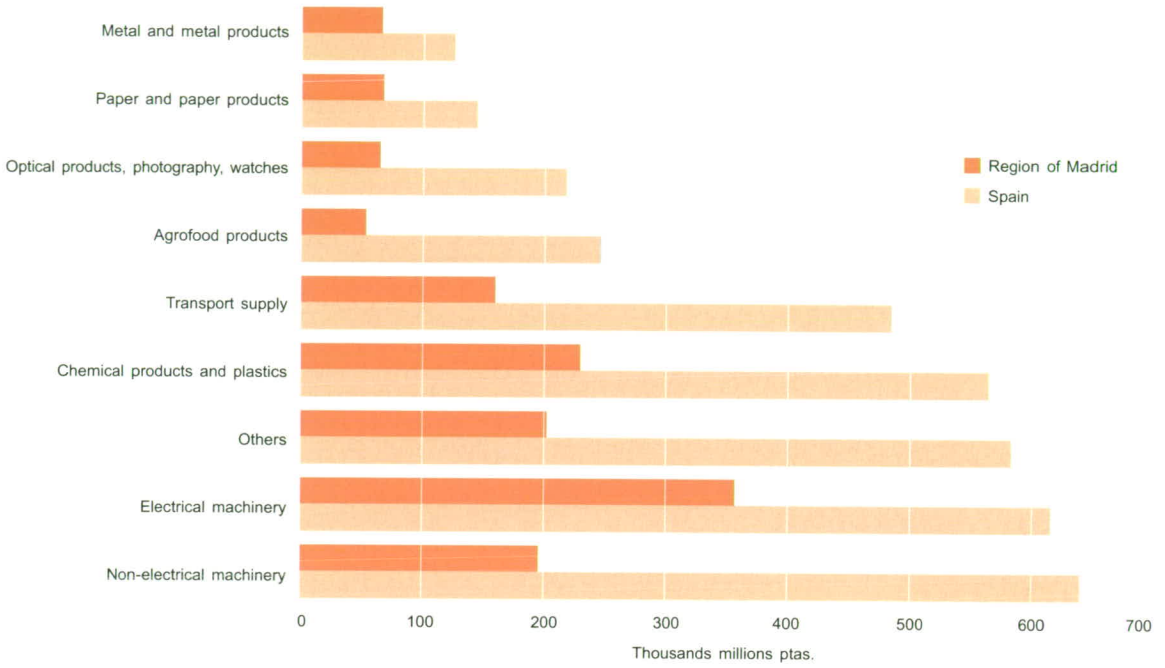

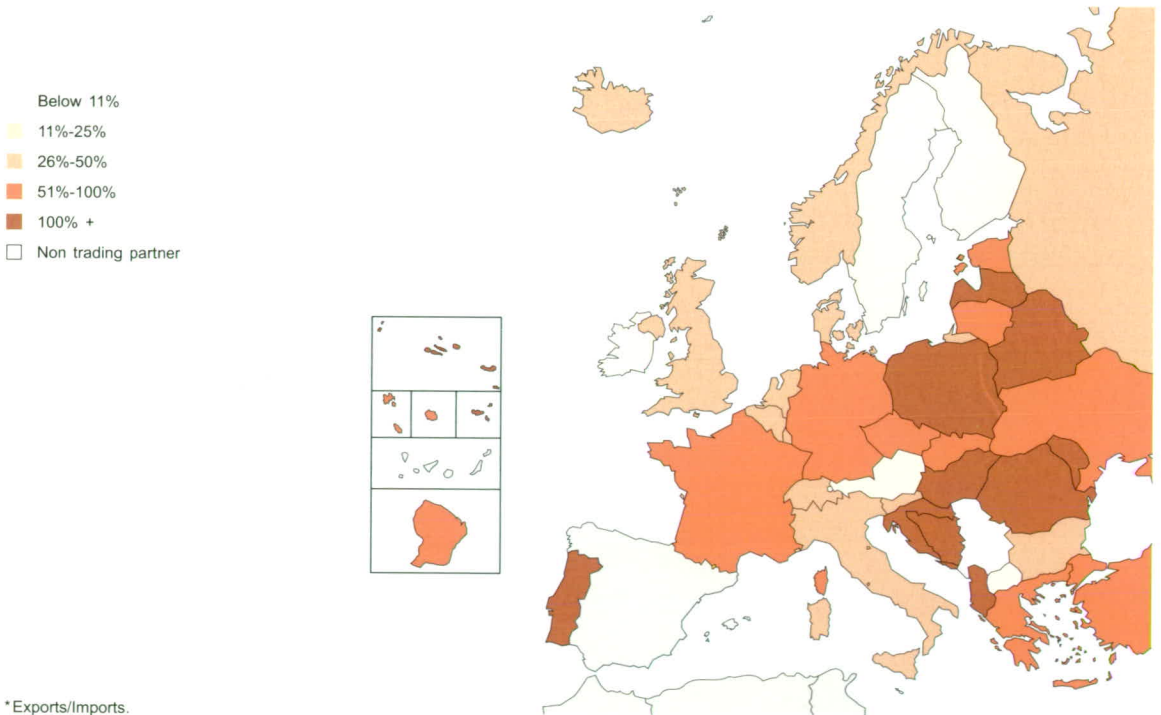

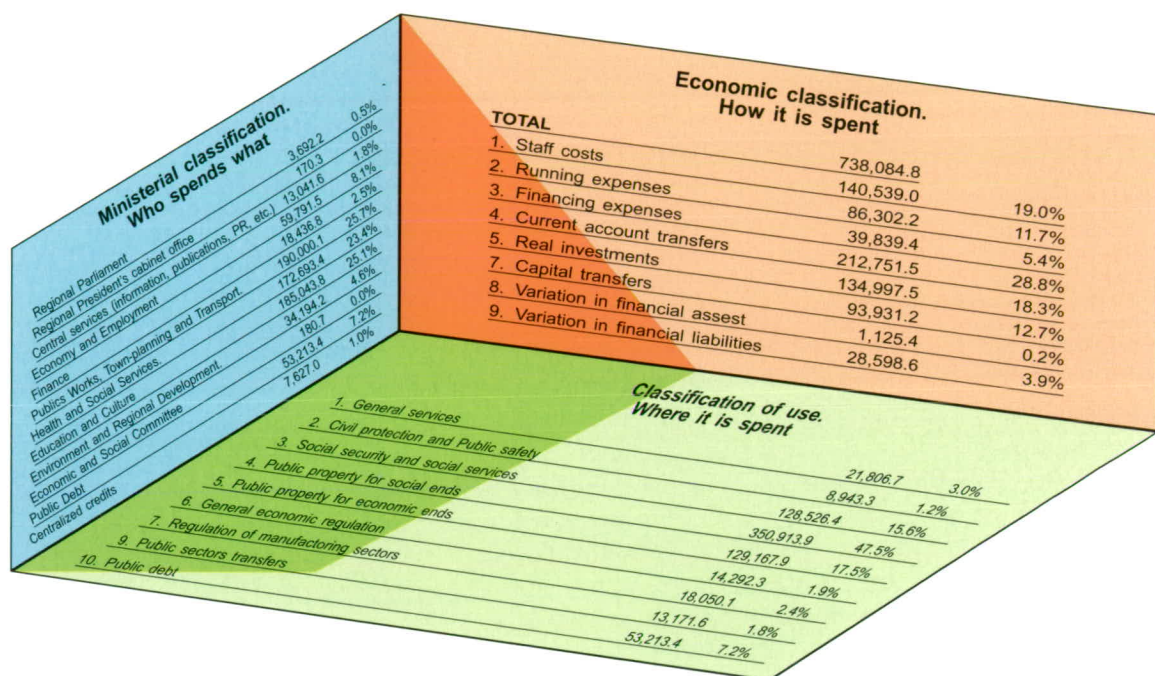

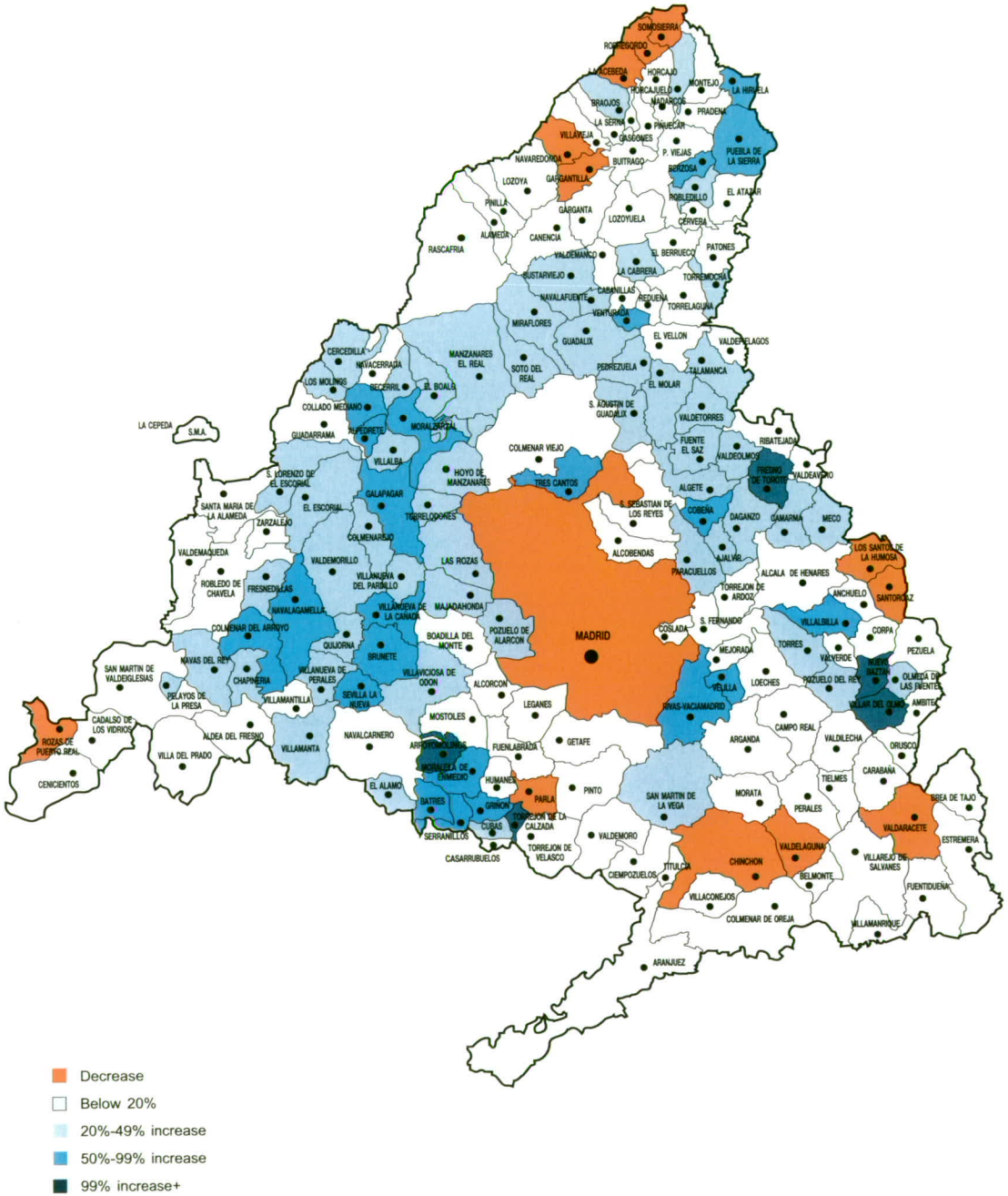

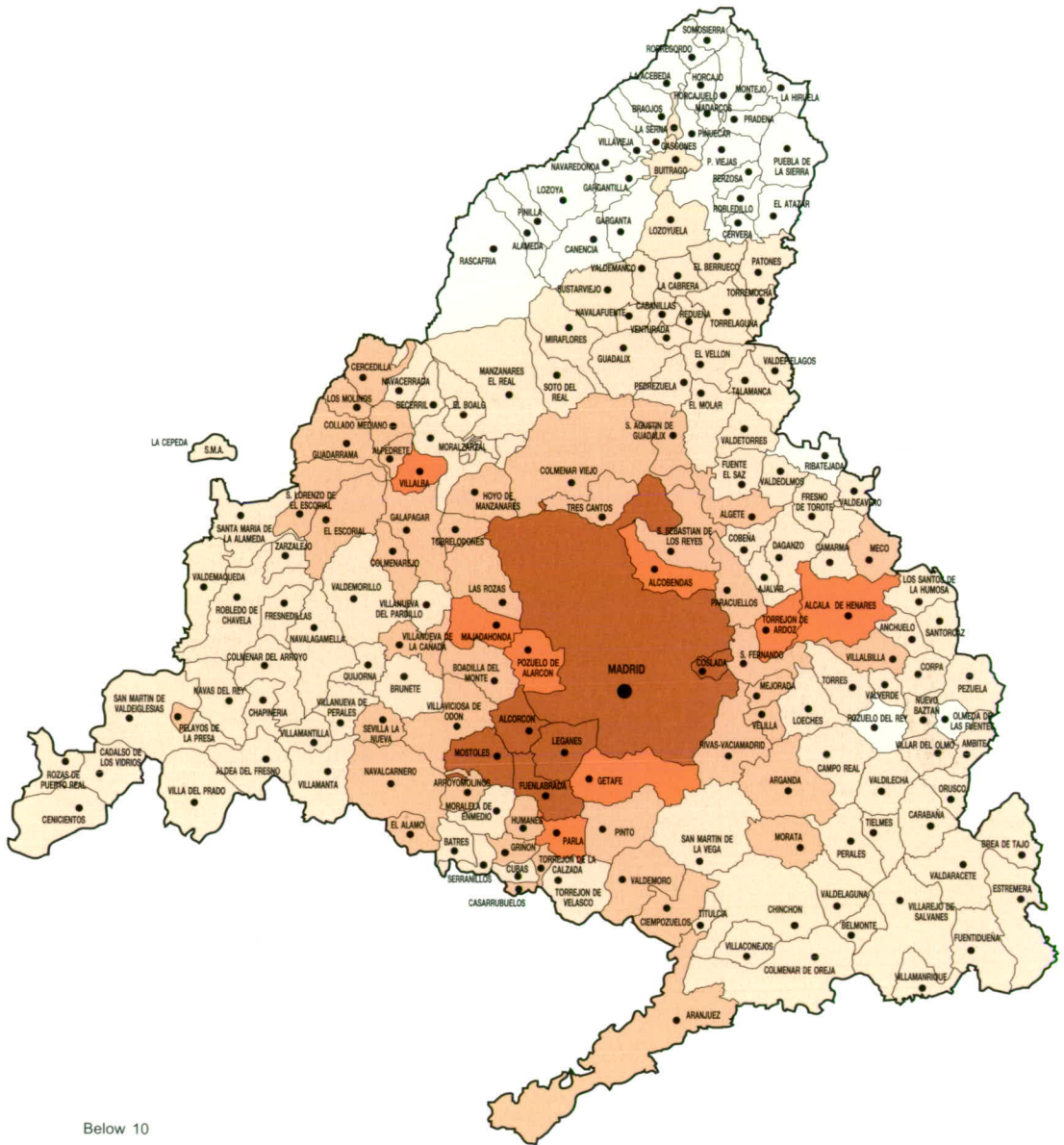

17.1. Population change (%) 1991-1996

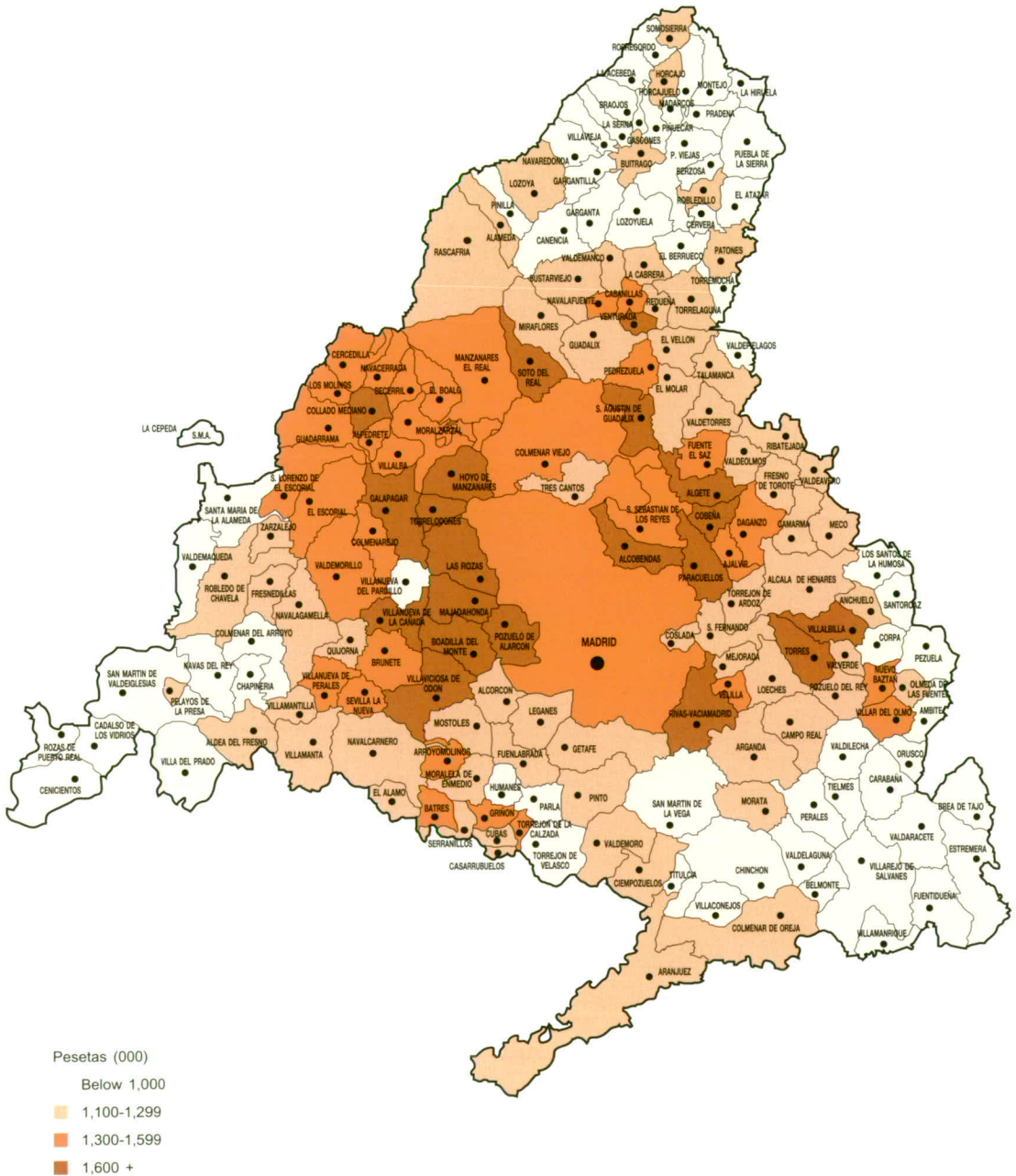


17.2. Population density, 1996 (inhabitants per Km²)

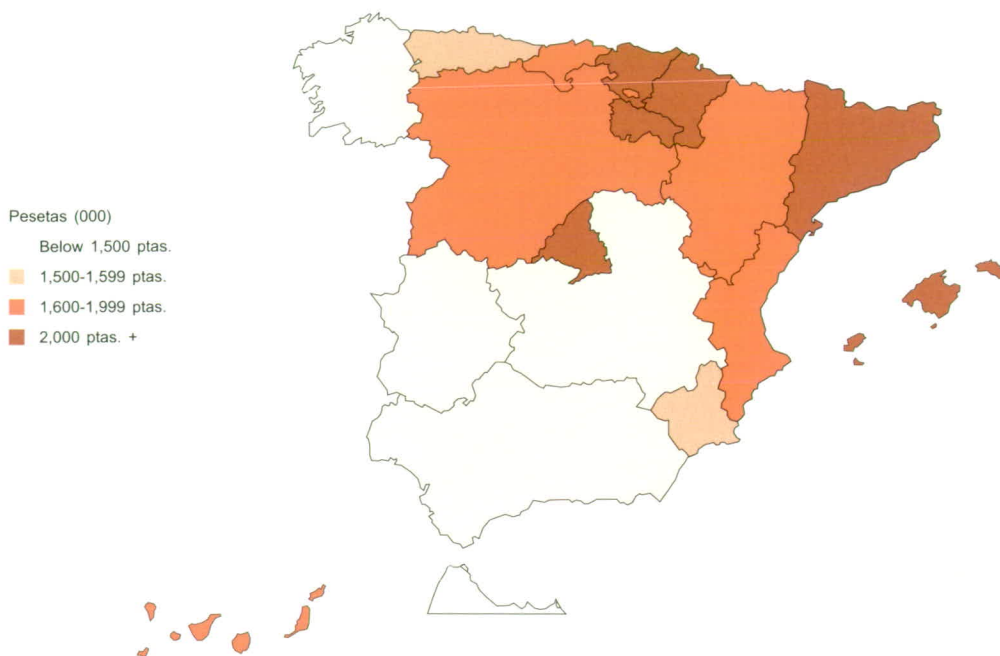

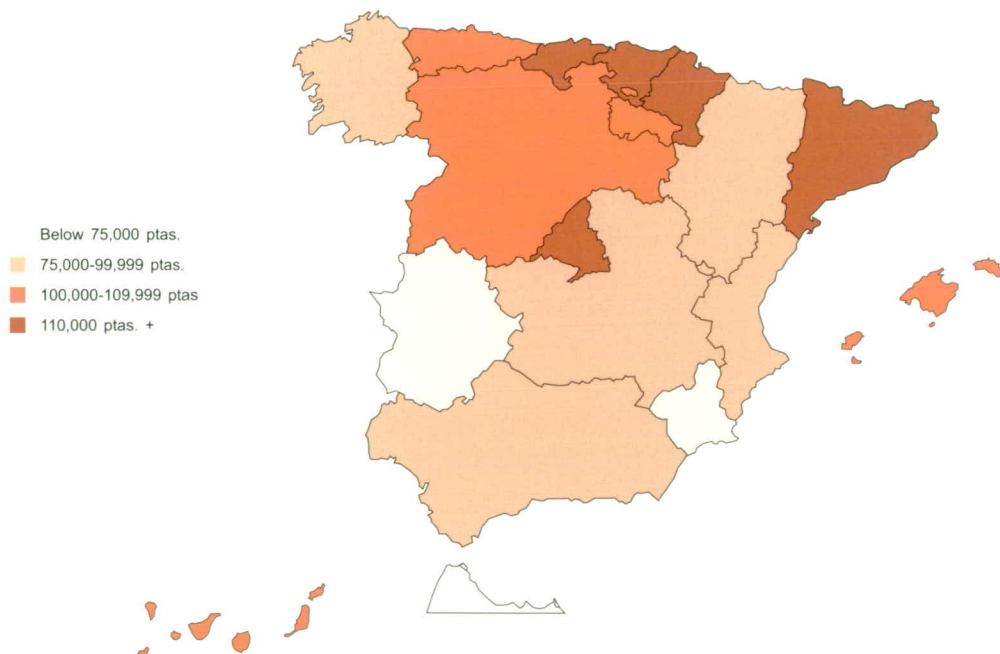
17.3. Per capita family disposable income by municipality, 1996 (provisional)



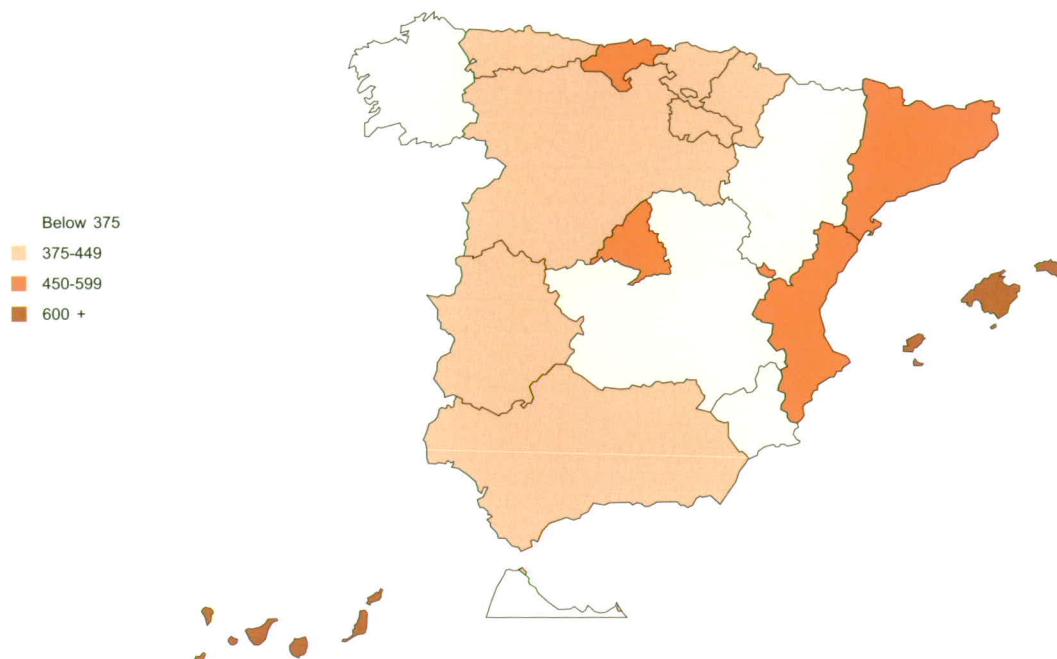
17.4. Gross added value per capita, 1995



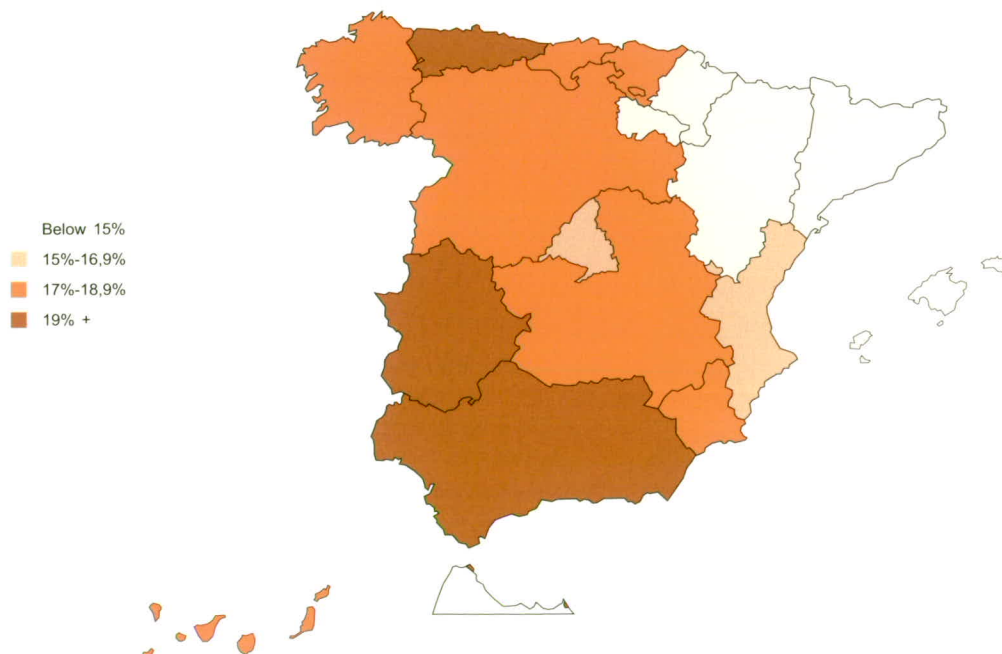
17.5. Price per m² of new build, 1997



17.6. Waste (kilograms per inhabitant per year), 1997

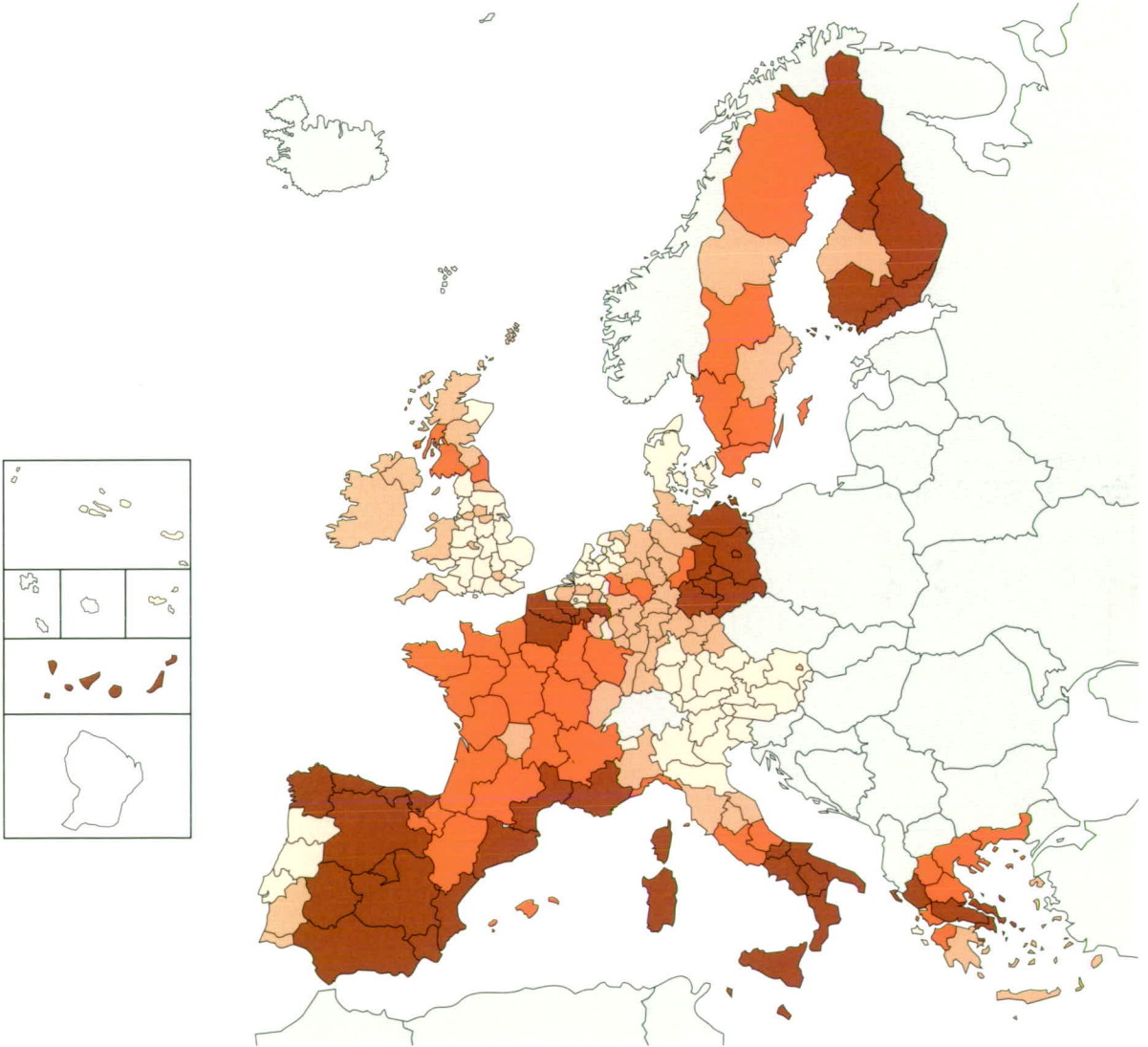


17.7. Spanish unemployment rate, 1998



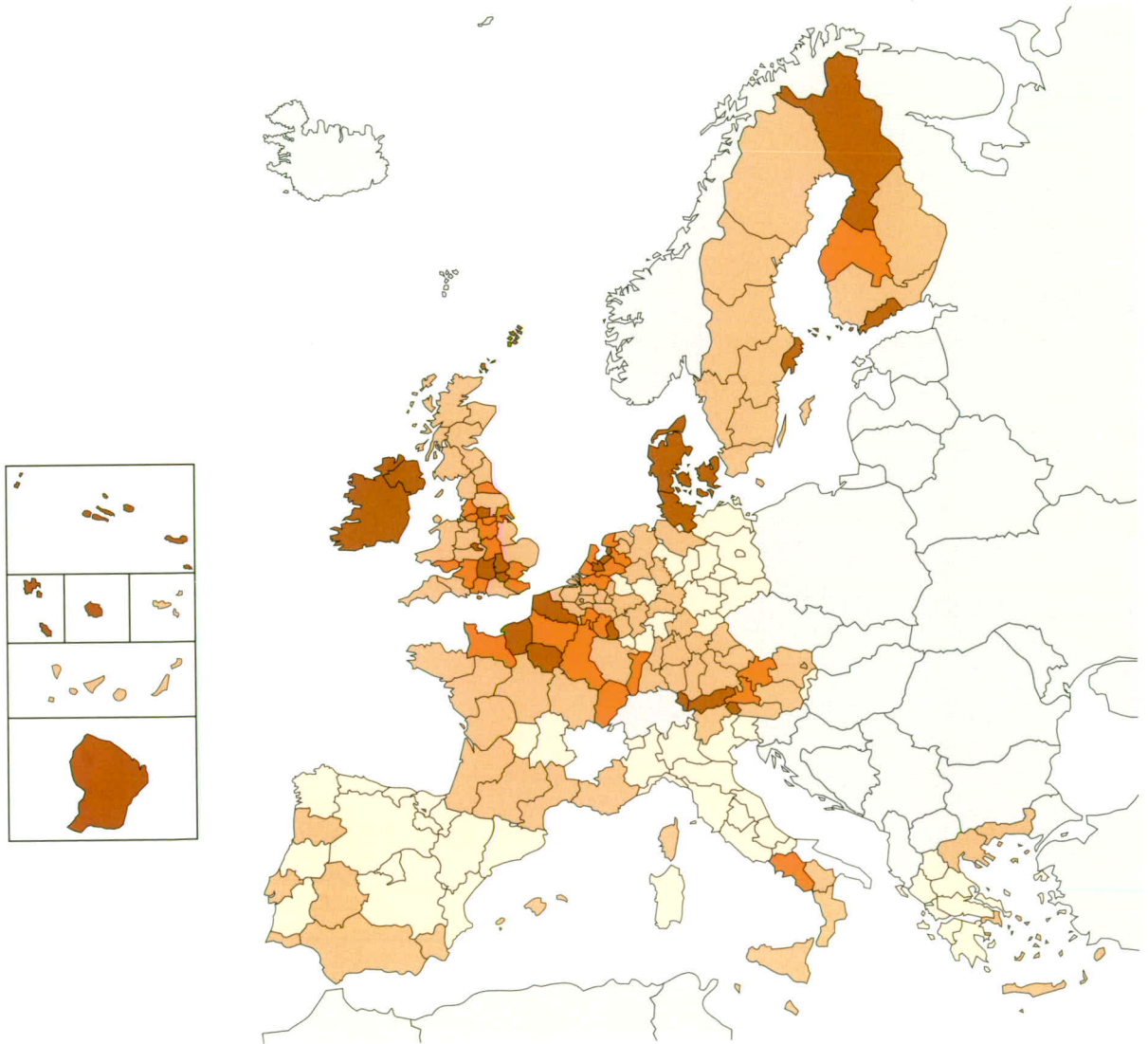
